2014 was the Earth's warmest year

since records began in 1880, according to reports from federal scientists published Friday. The finding reached by the [National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration](#) and [NASA](#) offers more confirmation of the planet's warming trend as a result of greenhouse gas emissions.

NOAA stated that 2014's combined global land and ocean surface temperature was 1.24°F above the 20th century average, surpassing the previous warmest year record set by 2005 and 2010.



Looking at the areas separately, the ocean was record warm, while the global land temperature was the fourth warmest. Further, the 20 warmest years all occurred in the past 20 years, and there have been 38 consecutive years of above-average global temperatures.

"This is the latest in a series of warm years, in a series of warm decades," stated Gavin Schmidt, Director of NASA's Goddard Institute of Space Studies (GISS) in New York. "While the ranking of individual years can be affected by chaotic weather patterns, the long-term trends are attributable to drivers of climate change that right now are dominated by human emissions of greenhouse gases."

Commenting on the record-breaking year, meteorologists Jeff Masters and Bob Henson [wrote](#): Climate change is already causing significant impacts to people and ecosystems, and these impacts will grow much more severe in the coming years. New research is painting a clearer picture of the tough decisions that lie ahead if we hope to reduce the serious risks that we and our planet face. As we approach the critical negotiations in Paris in December to hammer out a new binding climate change treaty, we should keep in mind that we can choose to take economically sensible steps to lessen the damage of climate change, and the cost of inaction is much higher than the cost of action.

Africa's Solar Revolution



A new solar energy movement is bringing kilowatts to previously unlit areas of Africa – and changing the lives of hundreds of thousands of people. The idea behind the latest effort isn't to tap the power of the sun to electrify every appliance in a household. Instead, it is to install a small solar panel not much bigger than an iPad to power a few lights, a cellphone charger, and other basic necessities that can still significantly alter people's lives.

Just as the countries of Africa bypassed the era of copper land line telephones in favor of cell phones, so this movement may enable them to become world leaders in consumer controlled local energy development.

Going smaller better fits the budgets of the rural poor. People use the money they normally would spend on kerosene to finance their solar systems, allowing them to pay in small, affordable installments and not rely on government help. The concept is called pay-as-you-go solar. The simultaneous development of low power LED lamps promises even greater efficiencies. Many see it as helping to overcome the problems that have plagued previous solar "revolutions" in Africa.

Civil liberties news in the Sunshine State



When we filed our marriage lawsuit last March, we knew that someday love would win in Florida and that the couples we represented would be able to have their marriages recognized in the state they call home. Today, that historic day has finally arrived. Finally, all loving couples across the state are able to marry, regardless of gender, and those who are already married outside of the state of Florida will have their marriages officially recognized.

The Civil War: An American Legacy with David Goldfield

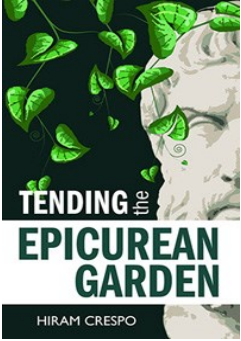

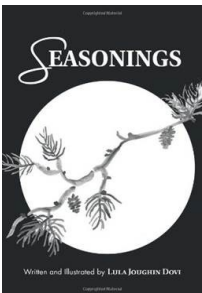

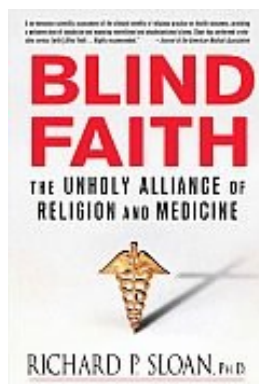

Recognize Religious Freedom Day

Enacted by Congress in 1992 and officially recognized every January 16 by an annual presidential [proclamation](#), Religious Freedom Day ought to be an official national holiday. After all we have off for Easter, the religious celebration that really should have no official recognition in a truly secular, democratic country. Let's celebrate one of the most important tenets of our country, [religious liberty](#).

What is Religious Freedom Day all about?

Religious Freedom Day commemorates the enactment of the [Virginia Statute for Religious Freedom](#) in 1786. From President Obama's 2014 proclamation we are reminded the Virginia Statute for Religious Freedom, penned by Thomas Jefferson, declared religious liberty a natural right and any attempt to subvert it "a departure from the plan of the Holy Author of our religion, who being Lord both of body and mind, yet chose not to propagate it by coercions on either. The Statute inspired religious liberty protections in the First Amendment, which has stood for almost two and a quarter centuries."

President Obama's 2014 proclamation

"Today, America embraces people of all faiths and of no faith. We are Christians and Jews, Muslims and Hindus, Buddhists and Sikhs, atheists and agnostics. Our religious diversity enriches our cultural fabric and reminds us that what binds us as one is not the tenets of our faiths, the colors of our skin, or the origins of our names.

"What makes us American is our adherence to shared ideals -- freedom, equality, justice, and our right as a people to set our own course."

The American Revolutionists' Resolve

The fact is American Revolutionists were fleeing from the official church of England, the Anglican Church, even as it crossed the pond and invaded the Virginia Colony. Their goal was to root out religious preferences and privilege within the newly established civil government, including paying out taxpayers funds to religion organizations and disallowing religious beliefs from invading civil law, NO MATTER THE RELIGION. Religious fanatics distort and try to rewrite U.S. history by declaring the country was founded as a "Christian" nation.

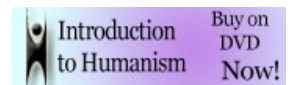
Jennifer Hancock started this organization several years ago. It uniquely serves Humanist families with a variety of wonderful programs throughout the year.

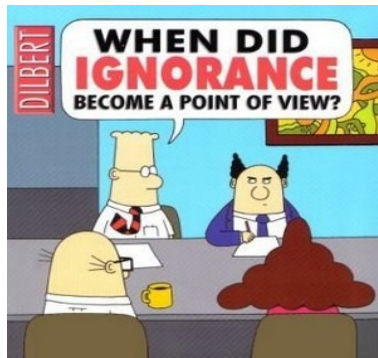

Congressional Majorities may threaten Church State Separation



Jim Inhofe, a Republican U.S. senator from Oklahoma, believes the making of public policy should be left to a higher power.

"[G]od's still up there," Inhofe, a Religious Right ally, opined in 2012. "The arrogance of people to think that we, human beings, would be able to change what He is doing in the climate is to me outrageous."

Whether or not you agree with Inhofe on climate change is a secondary matter: The fact is, he wants to craft legislation based purely on dogma favored by a handful of people instead of policies that would help the entire country. Inhofe, a former insurance executive, has ascended to the head of the Senate Environment and Public Works Committee – granting him a powerful platform from which to spread his ideas.

Inhofe received his promotion partly due to the Religious Right, which mobilized millions of voters who hate President Barack Obama ahead of the November elections. Thanks in part to the fact that 78 percent of white, evangelical Protestants who participated in an election last year voted for Republicans, both the U.S. House of Representatives and Senate are under conservative control for the first time since 2006. As a result, defenders of separation of church and state can expect a steady flow of congressional measures that could harm religious liberty.

The issues in play will include school voucher expansions, "religious freedom" exemptions to secular laws, the role of religion in the military and attempts to provide direct federal funding for houses of worship.

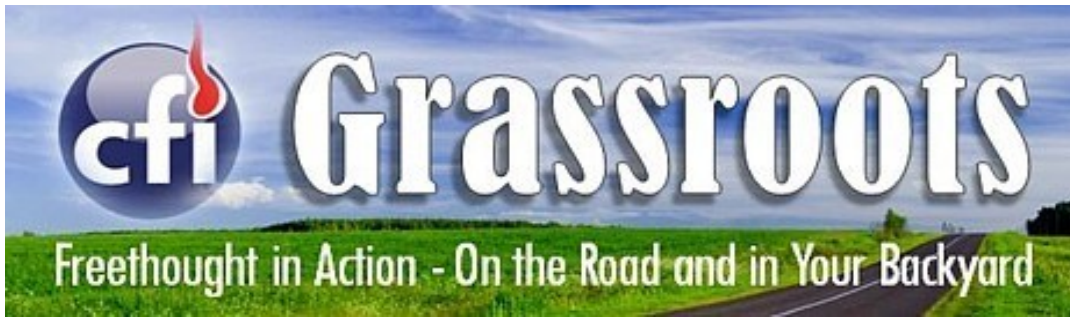
