What do Humanists Want?

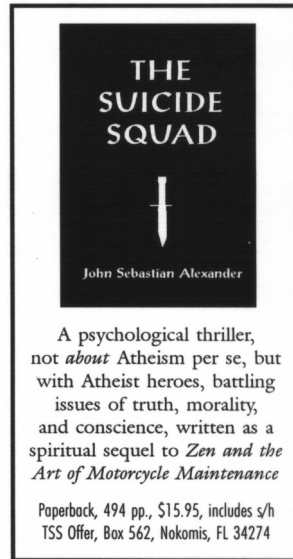
1. To extend a human centered approach to the critical problems of life and society.
